ANTIQUÉ CHAIN SAW DISPLAY AND FAST CUT COMPETITION

Chain saws have evolved over their history. Dig yours out of the closet and compare it to others. A fast cut competition will be held Saturday, August 22 from 3: 15 p.m. Classes are (Saws manufactured before 1960, followed by a class manufactured 1961 to 1975). Persons are limited to one entry per class. Saws will be dated from the Internet listings. Watch the chain saws of yester year perform. Safety clothing must be worn. (Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

Prizes for these classes are: 1st - \$40.00, 2nd - \$30.00, 3rd - \$20.00, 4th - \$10.00.

CROSS CUT SAW COMPETITION

A Cross Cut Saw Competition will be held Saturday, August 22, at 2:00 p.m., before the chain saw competition. Entrants must bring their own cross cut saws. This competition is meant for experienced cross cut competitors. Teams will make a timed cut through a 10x10 timber; quickest time wins. These are not the usual saws you pick up in a shed or

barn, half rusted through and dull as a hoe. These are state of the art, sharp saws which can cut with surprising speed. Safety clothing must be worn.

(Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

Prizes for this class: 1st - \$30.00, 2nd - \$20.00, 3rd - \$10.00.

CHAIN SAW and FAST CUT COMPETITION

Registration will be Saturday, August 22 from 1 - 2:00 p.m., at which time you pay a fee of \$20.00 and file a chain for a Husqvarna or a Stihl chain saw. Filed chains will be held by officials until the fast cut competition at 2: 15 p.m. Each competitor will be asked to make one cut downward and one cut upward through a 10x10 timber. All entrants, who compete, keep their chains. Safety clothing must be worn. Please come prepared. The class winners file a chain for the opposite chain saw and cut again using the opposite chain saw. Lowest combined time wins a trophy. (Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

CHAIN SAW OPEN/UNRESTRICTED FAST CUT COMPETITION

If it has a chain; you can carry it and make one cut downward and one cut upward and a second cut downward through a 10x10 timber, it qualifies. Fuel of choice. Competitors must wear safety clothing. (Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

2. Exhibits, once in the building, are under the control and subject to the orders of the Superintendent of the Department and cannot be removed or withdrawn without permission.
3. Arrangements and displays of articles will be under the control of the Superintendent and her/his assistants. No individual arranging will be permitted.
4. Competitors can make any number of entries, but will receive one prize, only, in each section.
5. Articles competing in this Department must be the bona fide work of the competitor and completed within the last year.
6. Any article soiled or defaced is not eligible for competition.
7. Any article previously shown at this Fair is not eligible for competition and will not be displayed.
8. Sale of articles will be allowed, but no deliveries will be allowed until after the Fair is closed.
9. Competitors are asked to read the prize list carefully and have entries conform to size, number, etc. in list.
10. Exhibits may be removed only at the close of the Fair.
11. Exhibitors must ensure that the Superintendent of Crafts is made aware which age class (especially children's) articles belong in.

REGULATIONS

1. Entries must be grown by the exhibitor, except materials in arrangements.
2. When the number of blooms, spikes, sprays, etc. is specified for a specimen, the exact number must be shown; otherwise the entry will be disqualified. Leaves should accompany each specimen.
3. The terms used in classification are defined as follows.
 - Bloom: One flower, at least one third open, on a single stem. e.g. Dahlia or Aster
 - Head: A number of small flowers on top of a stem. e.g. Verbena
 - Spike: Flowers on an extended stem. e.g. Salvia
 - Spray: Several flowers on short branches on one stem. e.g. Phlox, some Roses
 - Stalk: Several flowers borne along a stem on short petioles. e.g. Snapdragon
4. Accessories are permitted, but must be within size restrictions, as noted in each arrangement.

5. Containers for specimens will be supplied. Exhibitors may provide their own clear, plain glass jars or bottles.

6. Final placement of entries will be left to the discretion of the judge.

7. Exhibitors may win one award only in any given section.

8. The Show Committee is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged articles.

9. Entries will be accepted on Thursday evening 7:00 - 8:30 p.m. and on Friday morning, the day of the show, from 8:30 - 10:00 a.m. No exhibits will be accepted after 10:00 a.m., Friday morning.

10. All entries will remain at the show until Saturday 8:00 p.m.
