Playgroup with Janice: Free, every Monday 10am - 11:30am when there is school. For families with children, birth to age 5. Includes free play, art activities, reading, music, a healthy snack and an opportunity for the adults to connect. Note: There will be no Play Group on April 3 (Staff Training) or April 10 (Holiday).

At Home Learning Kits: A learning/play kit which includes activities for children (ages 1-5 years old), family activities (such as cooking), or an online component (such as a read-aloud book). These are prepared monthly when funding is available and pre-registration is required.

EmPower! Ladies Support Group: Come join us on Wednesday, April 5 and Wednesday, April 19, from 10am - 12pm. Come join us for a hot beverage, make connections to others in the community, have access to resources, and gain friendship.

Community Cupboard: Free for all community members to use. We welcome folks any time during our regular business hours (Monday - Thursday, 8am - 4pm). Come take what you need or leave what you can.

REGISTRATION is still open for Seed Kits & Family Food Box Program!

Seed Kits: We will have limited seed kits available to those who register. They will include a mix of seeds (Beets, Carrots, Green Beans, Kale, Lettuce, Peas, Pumpkin, and Yellow Beans) and a \$10 gift certificate to T&D Nursery for any of your gardening needs.

Family Food Box Program: This year we will have 24 available spaces for families* (*must have children living in your household under the age of 19). This program will be free for these families, each month (April through November, you will receive local, fresh produce at no cost to participants). We will have a waitlist for folks who do not have children at home, if we do not fill our spots with families, we will call you.

****NEW PROGRAMMING**:**

Free Meals for Families: Starting in April 2023. A partnership with the Forties Community Centre and their monthly suppers to help <u>support all families with children under 19</u> (living at home) to share in having a local, nutritious home cooked meal provided to them for free. Simply come to the Centre and let us know who in your household would like a free meal, present the coupons at the door of the supper, sit down and enjoy your meal or get take home and enjoy in your own home.

Girl Talk with Janice: Details will go home to families through the school for the intended population and will be posted on our Facebook Page as soon as information is available.

Some Programs & Services that can be offered when they are needed: **Pre/Post Natal** (individual or small group sessions to learn about pregnancy, childbirth, meet other new parents), **Rainbows** (emotional healing among children, grieving from loss or life-altering crisis), and **Nobody's Perfect Parenting Program** (open to all parents/caregivers of children age birth to 5 years, helps parents/caregivers recognize their own strengths and to find positive ways to raise healthy, happy children, building on what they already know and do for themselves and their children). **AMP-ed Up!** (adult group program that places an emphasis on understanding emotions, enhancing communication and stress management skills. Hi Mitchell,

Brush and tree mulching, Highway #12, Seffernville, Nova Scotia

My name is Sharon Millett. As I am writing this letter, your mulcher machine is mowing down my living fence, as explained to several people on the phone from your department today, to no avail, keeps the road smog from my organic vegetable garden. As the machine came closer to the fence I spoke to several people on the sign crew and managing to catch up to the head told him that I had called the Dept., to voice my concerns and no one got back to me. I asked him if he could get the guy driving the machine to not mulch down my fence. He said it wasn't up to him, that he was just hired for the sign work and when asked if he could call the people to call off the mulcher he said he doesn't speak to those people, the people who hired him. I next went to see if I could speak to the person operating the mulcher and I finally got his attention. I explained the situation to him and he said he could go back 50 feet. I explained that we ourselves keep the bushes back because the Dept., doesn't. I asked him if he'd been speaking with anyone about my living fence, he had, and the response was only in regard to, we can go 50 feet from the center line and to make sure he stays within that. He also stated that he was just doing his job and that that's what he was hired for.

Here's the problem I have. You have done no bush cutting on the sides of the roads for many years and then when it gets to the point of getting out of hand you bring in mulcher machines that require sign people, a huge machine that takes up half the road, rips and tears at the trees and leaves a mess behind. It takes several years to heal over the mess the machine makes. If you would do regular maintenance of the road you would not need the big mulching machinery, the noise, re-routing traffic, etc., Regular maintenance of the bushes on the road requires bush saws and chain saws and does not leave a path of destruction. Regular maintenance of the bushes means the trees and bushes do not get to the size that requires big machinery to come in and mow them down, does not require sign people as there is no machinery out in the road.

Here's the other problem I have. You have no respect for the people you serve, someone with respect would have called me back to address my concern, the people who are paying you to keep their highways safe by keeping the bushes and trees from growing out into the road, as stated by the head of the sign people, they are doing the work to keep the animals from coming out into the road. So nobody cared for the past 20 years as the growth was growing out into the road, just now? I also have a problem that there is no supervisor on hand to speak with today, every person I spoke with in person here today passed the buck to the next person. As I discussed with your mulcher driver today to keep him away from my living fence, we have been clearing the bushes ourselves because no one else has been, leaving our fence intact.

You have created a very unpeaceful situation here with your refusal to speak to me in person as I had to flag down the mulcher driver to get someone to speak to about my situation (to no avail). How safe is that?

Update from Tina Connors Councillor – New Ross (District 6)

National Volunteer Week is a time to recognize and celebrate our volunteers. This year's celebration takes place April 16 to 22, 2023. The theme for 2023 - Volunteering Weaves Us Together - recognizes the importance of volunteering to the strength and vibrancy of our communities through the interconnected actions we take to support one another. Volunteers get involved in various ways, bringing individual perspectives and abilities, adding to our collective resilience. Woven together from coast to coast to coast, volunteering reinforces our ability to grow, thrive, and create change within our community, province, and country.



During National Volunteer Week 2023, we celebrate our collective impact. Through kindness, generosity and commitment to volunteering, we weave our lives together. MUCH appreciation to all volunteers. Without hesitation, always willing to give your time, talent, and energy. Thank you.

Budget 2023-2024: The 2023-24 budget was approved at the March 23 Council Meeting. Careful consideration was given to the proposed budgets for all municipal departments, especially in terms of the magnitude of needs. The final budget reflects financial priorities for the upcoming fiscal year, as well priorities that align with our Strategic Plan.

The Operating Budget for 2023-24 is \$31,272,251 and the Capital Budget, \$19,266,261. Residential and commercial tax rates have been reduced: a one cent reduction in the residential rate, bringing it to \$0.695, and a three cent reduction in the commercial rate, to \$1.50.

A few things to note:

> total residential property assessments up 12.3%; total commercial property assessments up 15.3%;

> residential properties that fall under the Capped Assessment Program (CAP) in N.S. saw an assessment increase of 7.7% or less [* the CAP does not apply to commercial properties nor does it apply to any improvements (made) to a 'capped' residential property];

> 79.5% of Chester Municipality residential property assessments increased by 7.7% or less.

A substantial portion of our annual budget includes 'mandatory or non-discretionary expenditures'. Mandatory contributions include provincial services, such as: RCMP & correctional services; education; library services; and more. For 2023-24 this amount equates to approximately 58.6% of our general tax rate.

All budget information is available to the public.

On a final note, if you are ever in need of an extra copy of the municipal **Waste Collection Calendar**, don't hesitate to get in touch with me, maybe for yourself, for a new neighbour, for a cottager! I think it's a great resource and full of lots of useful information & extra fun tips!
