

We've spent the winter planning for the year ahead. After putting most of our events on hold for the last couple years, we're planning to make use of our post and beam

pavilion and host more on-farm events this year. We hope these events are of interest to both folks here in New Ross and also attract people to our community. Online registration and payment will be available on our website for each event. Although we're still working on fine-tuning details and dates, here's what we have planned so far:

Forest Bathing Wellness Walk (April 24) – Join us in the forest here on the farm with Wil Bruner, Certified Forest Therapy Guide and founder of Soft Pine Wellness for a 2-hour forest bathing and wellness walk experience. To read more about forest bathing and Soft Pine Wellness, check out their website (www.softpinewellness.ca) or reach out to us directly. Cost is \$40 plus tax per person, or \$70 plus tax per pair/couple. Deadline to register is April 21.

Dahlia Tuber Planting Demo (May 14) – If you're interested in growing dahlias, Christina has a limited number of surplus (no-name) tubers to share. She'll provide some details on planting and growing and dahlias supply 2 free tubers per participant. Stay tuned for registration details on this **free** event.

Herb Planter Workshop (May 28)- Plant your own take-home herb garden in a large planter. Participants will learn about growing and caring for herbs in containers, harvesting and preserving herbs.
