

If you've been by the Fairgrounds lately you would have seen a new wooden ticket booth set up to replace the older white one that had been at the entrance for years. This month's Community Spotlight is on Kyle Veinott and the sheds he has been building for approximately the last 3 years. Kyle is the youngest entrepreneur in New Ross with his portable mill, lumber services and buildings he has been constructing. His buildings have gone all over NS. They are not just storage sheds, they can be customized to fit any need or want.





Back in April Kyle and his crew completed the construction of the Rink Committee's new rink storage building. This is located towards the backside of the Fairgrounds next to the tug of war practice area.

You will also find one of his buildings sitting along Ruby's Trail in New Ross, known as Lady Bug Lodge.





Some of his creations have become dwellings for people. What started as a hobby has become a high demand item. Kyle and his helpers are busy every day.





Update from Tina Connors Councillor – New Ross (District 6)

Municipal Buildings: Main Administration and Annex - Considerable upgrades are required to our administrative buildings. Additional space (office/staff and storage) is needed, along with improvements related to accessibility. Staff presented a *New Building Options Report,* identifying nine options to address current building deficiencies. At this juncture, the option chosen by (the majority of) Council is to look at a retrofit and expansion of existing buildings on our current property, including the possibility of joining the two; and included with this, an off-site public works building. A Feasibility Analysis is being undertaken to provide the following information:



• a review of existing conditions (including: accessibility; security; mechanical heating; and cooling systems) and, reporting on major non-compliances;

• an evaluation of criteria for expansion such as office & storage space, and financial impacts; development of a functional work space building;

• a Class 'C' cost estimate of upgrading and expanding our current buildings with a new building (section) between the two existing buildings.

Recent Discussions at Council Table:

> New Ross Christmas Festival – presentation to Council, including event plans for the 30th Anniversary;

> Uniform Business Signage Program – the 'new' signs have been installed in the pilot project area, Exit 6/ Hubbards, with Exits 7, 8, and 9 to follow;

> Church Memorial Park – recent presentation, RE: Request for Funding for a Feasibility Study: Future of the Rink (renovate and maintain existing facility vs. build new).

Salary and Benefits Review: A Salary and Benefits Report for all positions - staff and councillors - has been completed by Gerald Walsh Associates. Council is reviewing the comprehensive report; determining equitable remuneration practices consistent with other municipal units is critical. The last review was done in 2010.

Sherbrooke Lake Public Access Update: The Municipality of the District of Lunenburg (MODL) has not begun development of Sherbrooke Lake Park as of yet; Council (MODL) did not allocate any funds to the project during their recent budget approvals for 2023-2024. The public access site is accessed either from Walden, or Mahone Bay.

I hope everyone's summer is going quite well (despite the rain)... with not too many pesky bugs! Be sure to support the many activities and happenings across our community - new events, recreation programs, community suppers, and of course our annual *New Ross Community Fair* August 18 & 19 - a truly great, funfilled time for all ages.

Dear Community Care Centre Board Members,

You may have addressed some of the following points at your most recent "gathering, to update the community on our progress", however, for those New Ross residents who were unable to attend, some may appreciate an update on the following aspects:

- 1. <u>Original Vision Change</u>: Could you please clarify when and why the original vision of an assisted living facility for seniors, located adjacent to the manor at the cross, was changed? Understanding the reasons behind this alteration would help the community better grasp the project's current direction.
- 2. <u>Qualified Management Company</u>: Can you disclose the name and credentials of the management company that will be responsible for implementing and running the proposed affordable housing rental complex? Additionally, it would be beneficial to know how the company plans to handle necessary maintenance and daily operations of both the units and the grounds once the project is in place.
- **3.** <u>Funding Sources</u>: Where will the funding for operating expenses come from? It's essential for the community to understand the financial aspects and the sustainability of the project.
- 4. <u>Infrastructure Support</u>: With a large complex of rental units being developed, how will the necessary infrastructure, such as water and sewer systems, be accommodated? Additionally, what measures are being taken to address the potential increase in traffic on the adjacent side dirt road?
- 5. <u>Impact on Local Taxpayers:</u> Could you provide a clear explanation of how this project will affect local taxpayers? Are there any direct tax implications for the municipality as a result of this development?
- 6. <u>Green Space Preservation</u>: The proposed project raises concerns about one of the largest green spaces in New Ross being compromised. Can you share information about how the green space will be protected or preserved despite the development?
- 7. Feasibility Study and Community Survey Results: Where can the community access the results of the New Ross feasibility study, needs assessment and the community survey? Having access to this information would allow residents to better understand the data behind the project's planning.
- 8. <u>Future Oversight</u>: In the event that your volunteer non-profit group is no longer able to oversee the project in the upcoming years, who will take over the responsibility for both the complex and the land? It's important to have a clear plan for the project's long-term management.

Thank you very much for your attention on these points of interest and we eagerly await your answers or responses by the September Flyer.

A SHOVEL & \$5,000,000

Thank you, community members, for the great turnout at the New Ross Community Care Centre Community Meeting on July 13. Thanks to the Christ Church Guild for the lunch, and the New Ross Legion for the space. Over 80 people came out to hear more about the project, see the preliminary designs and ask questions. It's not surprising in New Ross to see solid community support for projects that benefit the community, but it is endearing, and energizing!

The project is coming along, but to be successful, it will require community support – something at which our community excels. A project of this magnitude will add value to our community, in the way of safe, affordable homes for our community members. While the final plan, and cost estimates, are still being figured out, we anticipate the project to cost approximately five million dollars. As with any building project, the more we raise, the less we must finance, so we are starting the fundraising campaign with a goal to raise the full amount! To date, we've raised over \$300,000 and we're just getting started.


