Much loved by all the teachers in both New Ross School and Forest Heights, if anyone wanted anything fixed or built Konnor was up for the job. He was well known by his friends to be very much a country boy who loved fishing and will always be remembered for his schooling accessories like his backpack with the water bottle built in and toolbelt which carried any tool needed from a drill to a hammer and screwdrivers. If anyone needed a tool

chances are Konnor had it!! He may have also been known to ride his dirt bike to school when he knew he wasn't supposed to.

Konnor touched so many lives with his easy-going nature, his willingness to help, his kindness, his humor, his caring nature and gentle "old soul". This is a loss we are all feeling and the whole community needs a hug right now. Konnor may have only had 17 years in



but he made an impact on everyone that met him. He was a son, a grandson, a brother, a friend, a teammate, an inspiration.





This year at the Fair he decided to try arm wrestling for the first time ever and if ever there was a hero it was him! The crowd cheered so loud and we were all so proud of him! He may not have won but the smile he had that day will surely be remembered by many!

Community Spotlight



This month it was recommended to me to feature the Bookmobile in the Community Spotlight whereas it will be celebrating 50 years of service. And what a wonderful service it is to our community!

Bookmobile service at South Shore Public Libraries (SSPL) has been running since 1972; it was one of the original locations when public library service began in Lunenburg County. We've had many vehicles and many service schedules over the last fifty

years. Rural service has been and remains a priority for the South Shore Regional Library Board and staff at SSPL.

Currently, the Bookmobile visits New Ross every Tuesday at the Lions Club Park. During the school year the bus starts up at the school then moves to its public location. Visiting

New Ross Consolidated School has been a highlight for staff over the years. Seeing the kids browse and choose books is a delight, and now seeing some of those kids bring their own children on the bus is a real full-circle moment for staff.

The success of the New Ross School stop and the lessons learned there have led us to offer this service to New Germany Elementary starting this fall. In order to accommodate the new location we need to change the time of the New Ross stop. Starting September 12, we will be at NRCS at 10 am and then move to the Lions Club Park at 10:30am and remain there until 12 pm. This will mean a change of routine for folks and we understand customers may have questions. Switching to an hour earlier in New Ross helps us



to put books in the hands of another whole cohort of children and, for that reason, we thank the New Rossers for their understanding.

The regular weekly Bookmobile staff that serve New Ross on Tuesdays are Branch Coordinator Crystal and Lead Driver Wanda. Crystal has been with SSPL for almost 40 years working at many branches. Crystal has been at her latest location with the Bookmobile for 15 years. Wanda is brand new to the library, and she brings many years of excellent driving experience with the South Shore Centre for Education with her. Wanda joined us this spring when long-term driver Dave retired after 40 years with SSPL.

Several different vehicles have come and gone over the 50 years. All the Bookmobiles previous to this one have been repurposed school buses. The buses were purchased and retrofitted to library needs. The current bus, which hit the road last August, is purpose-



built from the chassis up to be a bookmobile. It features lightweight aluminum shelving, a hydraulic lift, and a WiFi mast for better internet connection and sharing.

Our much loved Bookmobile service is one of the cornerstones of South Shore Public Libraries for over fifty years. South Shore Public Libraries has been providing high quality public library services to Lunenburg and Queens Counties since 1972. There are library locations in Bridgewater, Greenfield, Liverpool, and Lunenburg, along with exceptional access to many outlying communities via the Bookmobile.

Dear Inquiring New Ross residents,

Thank you for your open letter in last month's Flyer. You raised some good questions, many of which were also asked at the community meeting. If you are asking these questions, we expect many others will want to know as well, and we are happy to answer as transparently as possibly.

We also had some engaging conversations with people at the New Ross Fair. If you have a question about the housing development that you would like answered, please call a Board member, message us through our Facebook page, or email us at newrosscare@gmail.com.

- 1. Strong Vision: The vision for the New Ross Community Care Centre remains unchanged: to be inclusive to all citizens that may require affordable housing. The NRCCC is dedicated to providing the ability, through appropriate housing and care, to allow individuals to remain in the community of New Ross by constructing a three phase, sustainable and affordable community housing model. This model will enable people of all ages to age in place, a concept of keeping our families near that is vital to maintaining our cherished way of life. Phase One is independent living townhouse/apartments. Phase Two is assisted living and Phase Three is a long-term care facility. Prior to purchasing the land, the NRCCC conducted a site evaluation analysis that weighed factors such as access/road network, site conditions and cost, and determined that the site on Rosebank Road would provide the most favourable conditions for all three phases, and allow for future growth.
- 2. Management Company: Viability and long-term sustainability of the project are vital components, and will guide the approach the NRCCC Board chooses to manage the project after completion. This work will be determined, in part, by the current Board, and the funding model it adopts. The more the Board can raise toward the project, the less that will have to be financed, helping to lower rents and maintain sustainability.
- 3. Funding Sources: A shovel and \$5,000,000 is the heading of the NRCCC's Flyer Notice last month. Not to be trite, but it really is that simple. The Board estimates the project will cost approximately five million dollars. While we anticipate having at least one major funding partner, the more the community can raise to fund the project, the less we will have to borrow. Lower debt will mean more of the income generated by rents can be used to maintain the building. We are working with provincial government representatives to find the funding program that best fits the need in New Ross. We are also investigating other funding sources. Demonstrated community support is important to potential funders. A recent grant from the Community Housing Transformation Centre has allowed us to hire a project manager to navigate this process as efficiently as possible.
- 4. Infrastructure Support: Part of the Community Housing Transformation Centre grant we recently received is dedicated to pre-planning and development. This includes planning for important components such as water, sewer, and traffic flow. While these challenges can be solved, they also allow for potential opportunities, such as partnering with neighbouring organizations and the municipality on infrastructure upgrades.
- 5. Impact on Taxpayers: New residential units will create additional assessment and therefore generate additional tax revenues for the Municipality. The assessment is determined by Property Valuation Services Corporation (PVSC). At this time the amount of the additional revenues is undetermined. The NRCCC could ask Council to consider reducing the amount of taxes owed to

- the Municipality under the Tax Exemption By-law. Under this by-law, non-profit associations have the option to request a partial or total exemption from property taxes. Other tax rates (i.e. sewer, streetlights, waste collection) would normally still be applied.
- 6. Green Space: Access to green space is an important part of our way of life in New Ross. Maintaining our country atmosphere is important to the NRCCC Board, and reflects how many of us choose to live. With 50 acres available for this project, we can ensure the that the townhomes/apartments will be built in a visually appealing manner, in keeping with other homes in the neighbourhood. This includes a generous buffer zone of trees between neighbouring homes and the building site as well as preserving as much of the existing forest as possible. The NRCCC has a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in place with the Trails Society, so the community trail way will remain open to all.
- 7. Feasibility Study: A feasibility study (which includes data from the needs assessment and community survey) was completed in 2020. It is available at newrosscare.com under the resources tab. Hard copies are available at the New Ross Family Resource Centre and the Bookmobile.
- 8. Oversight: The NRCCC Board will oversee management of the total project including construction and operations. An operating plan will be prepared and it will include hiring a property management firm and/or superintendent assistance. The operating plan will include a maintenance budget, required reserves, environmental and energy management, maintenance schedule for buildings and property, and leasing policies and protocols.


