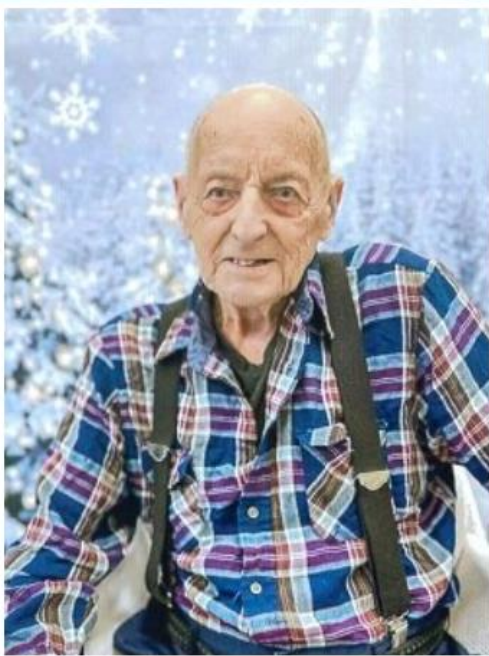
What better way to celebrate the start of the summer than to join the annual pumpkin planting days at Ross Farm Museum!

Community Spotlight



Late night, a packed arena, teams with boots laced up, suede coats on and adrenaline running high, the announcers calling up the first teams to flip for a side, teams taking positions, holes being dug, the announcer saying pick up the rope, team members on each side taking up pressure, all eyes on their coach, and with one drop of the hat the pull

starts! The arena comes alive with cheers for both sides, John Denver’s “Thank God I’m a Country Boy” blasting on the speakers, coaches watching for the perfect moment to give the heave signal, the announcer saying 2 minutes have passed, the rope tightening and pulling back and forth, finally teams switching into the backlock and giving every last surge of energy they have. The crowd erupting in cheers, And all at once the pull is over!



Anyone that has watched Tug of War before can go right back to those moments whether they pulled or were cheering from the side lines. Tug of war was popular in our community back in the 1960s – 1980s and is finally regaining popularity again. This year we have a new youth team of children that will be able to compete against 4H teams throughout the Province. As well we have 2 new women's tug of war teams and a men's team that will be representing New Ross starting at the first pull on June 8th in Eldridge Park, Falmouth. Pulls start at 2pm.

“Back in the day it was not uncommon, at the New Ross Fair, to see hundreds of people lined up to watch the tug-of-war pulls. Participants in competitive Tug-of-War train rigorously and compete fiercely. It's a demanding sport; it's not for the faint of heart. It requires you to expend all your energy and muscle in the span of 15 minutes and leaves you as a strengthless, quivering mass of jelly.” – George Broome

“Who makes a good tug-of-war team member? Typically, a good tug-of-war team member is a person who has the will to win and the will to never give up. A person who has 'heart'. He doesn't necessarily have to be the strongest person around. I have seen some of the best school athletes and strongest men not make it on the team. They simply did not want to put forward the effort. Or, as Al Pacino said in the movie 'The Scent of A Woman': "It's too damn hard!" They did not have the 'heart'. In a difficult pull, one has to dig down deep and persevere, even if there is nothing left in the tank. It hurts; and trust me, it hurts BAD.” – George Broome

Rich in tradition and a Community built on heart New Ross will continue to be represented in the world of tug of war. There is an old saying: 'Once it gets in your blood, it never leaves you'. Everyone is encouraged to come out and support our New Ross teams on June 8th in Falmouth!

Update from Tina Connors Councillor – New Ross (District 6)



Budget 2024-2025: The 2024-25 budget was approved at the May 16 Council Meeting. Careful consideration was given to the proposed budgets for all municipal departments, especially in terms of the magnitude of needs. The final budget reflects financial priorities for the upcoming fiscal year, as well priorities that align with our Strategic Plan.

The Operating Budget for 2024-25 is \$30,085,507 and the Capital Budget, \$32,866,390. There is a one cent reduction in the residential rate, to \$0.685, while the commercial rate remains the same at \$1.50.

A few things to note:

- total residential property assessments up 10.9%; total commercial property assessments up 15.3%;
- residential properties that fall under the Capped Assessment Program (CAP) in N.S. saw an assessment increase of 3.2% or less [* the CAP does not apply to commercial properties nor does it apply to any improvements (made) to a 'capped' residential property];
- 79.7% of Chester Municipality residential property assessments increased by 3.2% or less.

A substantial portion of our annual budget includes 'mandatory or non-discretionary expenditures'. Mandatory contributions include provincial services, such as: RCMP & correctional services; education; library services; and more. For 2024-25 this amount equates to approximately 57.5% of our general tax rate.

All budget information is available to the public.

Recent Discussions at Council Table:

- > Policy P-118 Municipal Elections Policy – a new policy introduced, providing direction to both first-time candidates and those with time-served, regarding appropriate pre-election activity;
- > Municipal Buildings: Main Administration and Annex – Feasibility Analysis Report received (R.V. Anderson Associates Ltd.) with consideration to: retrofit and expansion of existing buildings or building new;
- > Church Memorial Park (CMP) Arena Facility – recent presentation by CMP board members, outlining the current condition of the facility, sharing with Council and staff the critical need for roof repairs, including: curling club (on its own) \$800,000 +/-; curling club and hockey rink \$1.5 million.

6. The word "Blood" is written in bold and water is not written in bold. So, the answer is **"Blood is thicker than water"**.
7. The word Bee is written with extra 'e' in a line. So the answer is **"Bee line"**
8. The word cancelled is written in Check or right mark. So the answer is **"Cancelled Cheque"**
