Did you know...



That New Ross has a Trails Society that is currently aiming to develop a network of trails in the New Ross area that appeal to a wide variety of user types, and are being developed for the health and wellness of every user? One of the newer trails is **Popner Hill Trail** which was part of the Old Annapolis Trail. This trail was the first attempt to connect Halifax and Annapolis Royal. Work began in 1784 but it was never completed. (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Old_Annapolis_Road,_Nova_Scotia).

This is a combination of woodland trail and tree-lot road. It is 2.5km uphill on the way up to the ridge, and downhill on the way back. At the ridge you have a wonderful view of the village of New Ross, Porcupine Hill, and distant views of the ocean. It is great for hiking, biking, horseback and can be accessed by parking across from Hughes Diesel (134 New Russell Rd.), crossing through Hughes Diesel workyard, where you'll reach a connector path to the trail. Popner Hill Trail, which can be used for walking, hiking, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing and also enjoy fresh air on horseback.





Dear Brian

Thank you for your letter dated August 9, 2022, to Premier Tim Houston regarding the condition of Lake Ramsay Road and attached petition. As Area Manager for Lunenburg/Queens, the Premier has requested that I reply on his behalf.

The Department of Public Works (DPW) manages 23,000 kilometres of roads and 4,100 bridges, repaving priorities are evaluated and ranked on a continuous basis considering a number of factors. DPW is aware of the condition of Lake Ramsay Road and will make every effort to maintain the road with patching and routine maintenance activities, until such time that this road is repaved. We are currently evaluating candidates for future highway improvements, and I can assure you that we will consider Lake Ramsay Road as a part of this process.

Our mandate is to collect, document, preserve, interpret, and make known the historical and genealogical facts of the New Ross District, formerly known as Sherbrooke.



Did you know...

That the monument beside the Legion is called a cenotaph? A cenotaph is a monument erected in honour of a person or group of people whose remains are elsewhere, especially people who died in a war.



But did you know that the original cenotaph was not located beside the Legion but instead it stood at the Cross next to R. Basil Elliott's store? Where the Home Hardware is today.

The base stone was placed at the crossroads in August of 1917. It was the first monument to be erected in Nova Scotia to honour ex-soldiers who settled in New Ross as well as those who served in World War I. The finished or polished stones and crown were placed on the base in the fall of 1918. Then in 1959 when Highway 12 was being re-built the cenotaph was relocated to its current location next to the Legion on the north side of the Forties Road about 200m west from Highway 12.





The likeness of a soldier on a stone column was placed atop the monument in the 1990s. In October 2017 newly added insignia and dedications has made the cenotaph contemporary.


