


New Ross Outdoor Rink

Over last two winters a dedicated group of volunteers, with the help of the New Ross Volunteer Fire Department, Farmers Association, Development Society, and community members, have worked countless hours to create an outdoor skating rink underneath the pulling arena at the New Ross Fairgrounds. This skating surface has been very popular with skaters of all ages, so much so that the New Ross Rink Committee is now working towards the goal of purchasing a 40 ft by 80 ft rink kit. This rink kit will provide a slightly larger ice surface, simple assembly, and the ability to grow with the needs of the community. Fundraising and grant applications for this project have started with the hopes of reaching our goal this fall so the new improved rink will be in place for this upcoming winter. To date we have raised \$6,200 of our \$18,000 goal.

The Rink Committee is now asking the community for their continued support to help make this project a reality. By donating you will help get this project up and running. We can issue tax deductible receipts and donations need to be made out to the New Ross Volunteer Fire Department with New Ross Rink in the memo line. 




