# **Update from Tina Connors Councillor – New Ross (District 6)**

**Municipal Election 2024 (District of Chester):** As many of you are aware, it is my intention to reoffer for this upcoming term and to put my name forward as a candidate for District 6, Councillor, Municipality of the District of Chester. **Nomination Day** is Monday September 10. **Election Day** is Saturday October 19. (*Advance Poll* will run from 8:00 a.m. October 6 to 7:00 p.m. October 19 [Election Day].)

I have been extremely honoured to act as your representative for the past three terms. I was first elected in October 2012, and for me, there have been many milestones during my years proudly serving as the community voice to municipal government.



**For Your Interest:** District of Chester **policies** directly related to Municipal Council, include: Municipal Election Policy (P-118); Code of Conduct Policy (P-102); Remuneration of Warden, Deputy Warden and Councillors (P-09); Expense Policy (P-95); Council and Committee Procedural Policy (P-109). The **meeting time** of *Council* and *Committee of the Whole* Meetings has been changed. The meetings have been moved to the evenings - 6:00 p.m. - from the regularly scheduled morning time slot. The decision was made to allow for those with an interest in running, to put their name forward. Evening meetings, quite simply, accommodate a greater number of potential candidates. The decision will be reviewed in the Fall, by the new Council.

Consideration is being given to other barriers and challenges that may come into play for potential candidates, for example: accessibility; transportation; campaign experience & available information; child care; and more. In preparation for the upcoming election, the municipality will be hosting *Information Sessions for Interested Candidates* ("Campaign School"), in August. The two sessions, as follows: August 14 - 6:00 to 8:30 p.m. and August 21 - 2:00 to 4:30 p.m. Call to register!

**Sherbrooke Lake Public Access Update:** The Municipality of the District of Lunenburg (MODL) has not begun development of Sherbrooke Lake Park as of yet; Council (MODL) did not allocate any funds to the project during their budget approvals for 2024-2025. The public access site is accessed either from Walden, or Mahone Bay.

**Did You Know:** 211 Nova Scotia - an Information and Referral Service - is designed to help people navigate the complex network of community and social services in our province. 211 is a free, confidential service, available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. #### ANTIQUE CHAIN SAW DISPLAY AND FAST CUT COMPETITION

A fast cut competition for working, antique saws will be held Saturday, August 17 beginning 3:15 p.m. The Classes are (Saws manufactured before 1960, followed by a class manufactured 1961 to 1975). Persons are limited to one entry per class. Saws will be dated

from the Internet listings. Watch the chain saws of yester year perform. Safety clothing must be worn. (Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

**Prizes for each class are:** 1st - \$40.00, 2nd - \$30.00, 3rd - \$20.00, 4th - \$10.00.

#### **CROSS CUT SAW COMPETITION**

A Cross Cut Saw Competition will be held Saturday, August 17, at 2:00 p.m. Entrants must bring their own cross cut saws. This competition is meant for experienced cross cut competitors. Teams will make a timed cut through a 10x10 timber; quickest time wins. These are not the usual saws you pick up in a shed or barn; half rusted through and dull as a hoe, but are state of the art, sharp saws. Safety clothing must be worn. (Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

**Prizes for this class:** 1st - \$30.00, 2nd - \$20.00, 3rd - \$10.00.

#### **CHAIN SAW FILING and FAST CUT COMPETITION**

Registration will be Saturday, August 17 from 1:00 - 2:00 p.m., at which time you pay a fee of \$20.00 and file a chain for a Husqvarna or a Stihl or a Jonsered chain saw. Filed chains will be held by officials until the fast cut competition at 2:15 p.m. Each competitor will be asked to make one cut downward and one cut upward through a 10x10 timber. All entrants, who compete, keep their chains. Safety clothing must be worn. Please come prepared. The two fastest times in the 3 classes will file a chain for the opposite chain saw and cut again using the opposite chain saw. Lowest combined time wins a trophy. (Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

**Prizes for each Class:** 1st - \$30.00, 2nd - \$20.00, 3rd - 10.00

#### CHAIN SAW OPEN/UNRESTRICTED FAST CUT COMPETITION

An Open/Unrestricted Chain Saw Fast Cut Class will be held 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, August 17 with registration Saturday between 1:00 - 2:00 p.m. If it has a chain; you can carry it and make one cut downward and one cut upward and a second cut downward through a 10x10 timber, it qualifies. Use fuel of choice. Competitors must wear safety clothing. (Competitors will be required to sign a waiver form.)

**Prizes for this class:** 1st - \$40.00, 2nd - \$30.00, 3rd - \$20.00, 4th - \$10.00.
