GENERAL INFORMATION regarding off-highway vehicles



Children, youth, and their parent or guardian must have a safety training certificate, either by passing a safety training course or by passing a safety training test (16 or older with a valid driver's license).

Children between the ages 6 and 15 can drive any type of OHV when they are supervised (within sight of) a parent or guardian. Both the adult and child must have a safety training certificate. Drivers aged 16 and older must complete the appropriate safety training program.



Church, Port Williams, with Reverend Maya Bevan to officiate. Following the service, you are invited to join the family at a reception in the church hall.


