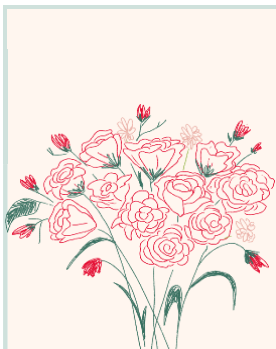
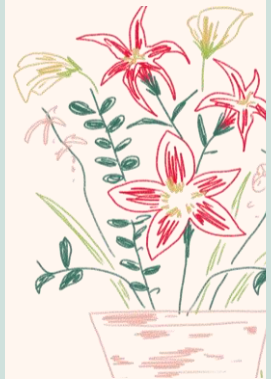

For your information:

On March 29, 2018, a request for a boundary review, for the boundary between New Ross and the Forties, was presented at the Municipal Council. Council asked, at that time, that the staff prepare a report on the New Ross - Forties community boundary. The “Information Report” submitted by Sylvia Dixon on **September 20, 2018** found this:

“In the opinion of the municipal staff, the Forties GSA boundary follows the original 40 land grant properties along the eastern edge. It then spreads out into the surrounding rural landscape to take into account the road access in the area. [Images of the land grant maps were attached to this report]. Current community name signage aligns with this boundary. In 2009 the Civic Address Coordinator worked with the Municipal Councillors for about a year to make sure these boundaries were correct. The GSA Boundaries were approved by Council in 2010”

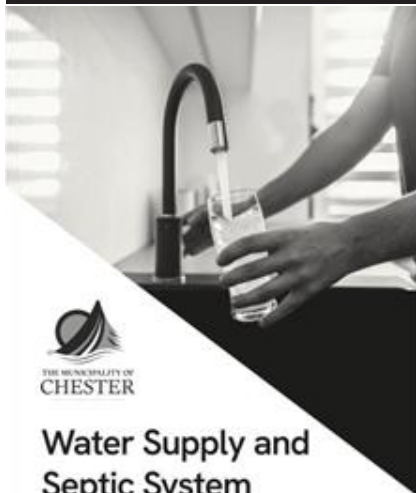
On **September 11, 2025**, members of the Forties Community presented at Council a petition in favour of maintaining the current boundaries that have existed for over 200 years. The petition gained 212 signatures to keep the boundary at Lot 1 on Mac’s Hill. Specifically, of the 63 occupied residences between Mac’s Hill and the Twenty brook, 70 signatures from these residents support the current location.

Water Supply and Septic System Upgrades Program

No one should have to worry about the quantity and quality of their water supply. Yet longer periods of drought are causing wells to run dry, and failing septic systems risk contaminating already stressed groundwater and surface water sources.

To help manage the cost of improving these on-site services, the Municipality of Chester has created the **Water Supply and Septic System Upgrades Program**. This program provides eligible property owners with low-interest loans to improve their on-site systems and ensure access to a clean and reliable water supply.

Eligible Upgrades

If the upgrade repairs or replaces an existing water supply or septic system that's not performing as it should, it's likely covered through this program. Examples of eligible upgrades include:

- Installing a drilled well
- Replacing a failing septic system
- Repairing a well pump
- Upgrading a water treatment system

Who Qualifies

You qualify to participate in this program if you are:

- An owner of a one-unit or two-unit residential property within the Municipality of the District of Chester (it must be your primary residence); or
- A registered not-for-profit organization within the municipality.

New construction, properties without an existing water supply or septic system, and properties exempt from paying property taxes are ineligible for this program.

To the Members of the New Ross District Museum Society,



Update from Tina Connors Councillor – New Ross (District 6)

A quick reminder to community organizations that the annual deadline for the **Municipal Recreation Grant Program** is October 3. Contact the Recreation Office at 902-275-3490 with any questions.

Water Distribution Program: District-wide potable water distribution program provides 4 litres of water per day per person per household up to four people. Similar to previous years, the program is coupon-based and available to residents of the Municipality.

The 2025 program started on August 18 and to date (as of Flyer deadline) the Municipality has distributed 26,194 coupons with a retail value of \$68,000. There are 472 dry well reports, which includes both drilled and dug (wells).

Community Boundary Discussions - Forties; Charing Cross: A Community Meeting is being planned in the coming months to discuss local boundaries, focusing on the Forties and Charing Cross areas. The details are still to be finalized, including: location, date, time.

The session will provide a chance for an open engagement/ discussion. This will be the opportunity to hear from everyone, to listen, learn and share.

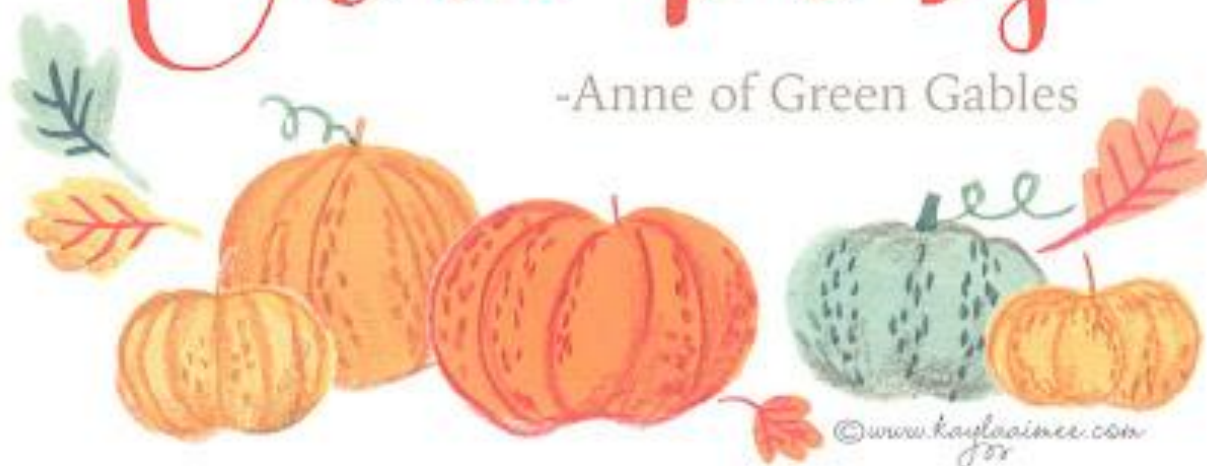
