Summer has returned, the sun is shining and spring is in the air. It has been an eventful first year as Executive Director, at Ross Farm Museum, and I am looking forward to a great summer. Spring is time for renewal, and for the last twelve months, we have been working on strengthening the museum's role as a focal point for New Ross and a key attraction in the south shore.

I am very proud of our team at the museum. Despite challenges and public adversity last summer, we had over 25,000 visitors to the farm, hosting weddings, community events, exhibits and expanding on our workshops and demonstrations. We continue to be a source of knowledge and education for guests of all ages. Our senior interpreters have decades of knowledge and hands on crafting experience. They are cultural treasures we are proud to have and support. Our interpreters continue to amaze visitors with their stories of the past, anecdotes and lessons about how life was in Nova Scotia and how it relates to us now. Without them, there would be no museum.

We have strengthened our mandate to not only demonstrate traditional crafts and skills but expand on opportunities to teach and pass on the knowledge. We are reaching out to members of the community to come and share their experience, interests and skills related to rural life and traditions. Partnering with other organizations and groups we have increased the accessibility of the education centre and become a focus point for the community. We are in discussions with the municipality and other stakeholders to provide more opportunities to support the New Ross Community.

The Hearthroom Café continues to grow and evolve, with a new summer menu coming in May and special events on weekends over the summer. We are also getting more requests for caterings and luncheons. We will also be incorporating more of historical cooking, pickling, jams and jellies into the mix. We look forward to continuing to adapt to the local tastes of our visitors and regulars.

The recent budget cuts have had an impact on our plans at the museum. We are forced to make more with less, something that the founders of New Ross were very familiar with. This is requiring us to adapt, find new partners and experiment with new ideas and technologies. Tapping into the New Ross community will be essential to the future of the museum. I look forward to the new challenges, to continuing to support the community of New Ross and to see the museum grow and be a beacon from the past lighting the future youth of Nova Scotia.
